

## Winners Crowned In Indiana Trap Shoot

CLINTON, Ind., July 20.—(Special)—The State Handicap championship of the Indiana State Trap Shoot was captured by 13-year-old Tommy Turpen of Evansville. Turpen won out in a shoot-off with H. L. Ware of Indianapolis after both had broken 98 birds out of 100.

Billie Jean Cheek, daughter of H. L. Cheek of Clinton, won the Ladies' State Handicap. She was proclaimed high on all targets for the four days with 873 birds out of 900. Miss Cheek had a 97-100.

Nine marksmen tied for third and fourth places for the four-trophy contest which was open to all shooters. Barnes Bradley of Louisville, Ky., was undisputed winner with 99-100, and Leonard Riggs of Peoria, took second money with 98-100. In the shoot-off for third and fourth, R. Meadlo of Evansville broke 25-25 for third and Spence Steinmetz, Crawfordsville, missed one out of 25 for fourth place.

George Heaney, of Indianapolis, was professional champion with 98-100. H. L. Cheek, besides his high-on-all-target win, was all-around champion of the meet with 387-400. On Friday, Cheek defended his state doubles championship with a 95-100 victory.

Also on Friday, the Class A, B, C and D, resident and non-resident matches were held as well as the first and the second Lewis Class Trophy shoot.
