

TRAP SHOOTERS' TOURNAMENT.

League of Indiana Clubs at Limited Gun Club Park.

The annual tournament of the Indiana Trap Shooters' League began at the shooting park of the Limited Gun Club yesterday afternoon. The business meeting was held at the Grand Hotel last night, when it was decided to hold the next tournament at Crawfordsville, and it was understood that the event two years hence will be held in Indianapolis. The officers chosen for the coming year were as follows:

There are twenty-one clubs in the league, and each of them is represented. They are: Limited Gun Club, Indianapolis; Erie Gun Club, Huntington; Greensburg Gun Club, Highland Gun Club, Elkhart; Crawfordsville Gun Club, Electric Gun Club, Ft. Wayne; Hartford City Gun Club, Peru Gun Club, Hazlewood Gun Club, Anderson; Lafayette Gun Club, Indiana Mineral Springs Gun Club, Kokomo Gun Club, Wabash Gun Club, Marion Gun Club, Muncie Gun Club, Bedford Rod and Gun Club, Lake City Gun Club, Washington Gun Club, Terre Haute Gun Club, Bloomfield Gun Club and Southport Gun Club.

The shoot was continued on the grounds of the Limited Gun Club to-day. There were eleven events yesterday, alternating fifteen and twenty birds, and this morning there were eight shoots of twenty birds each. This afternoon there was a forty-bird team race. These events composed the program, and the interest centered in the five high guns which shot out the entire program. In addition to this there was the shoot for the handsome diamond badge, which carried with it the championship of the league for one five events—the last three twenty-bird five events—the last three twenty-bird events yesterday afternoon and the first two twenty-bird races this morning. The shoot for the championship badge was spirited, and excellent scores were made. It was won by Elmer Apperson, of Kokomo, by a score of 93. Ed Voris, the holder of the championship last year, was second, with a score of 92. The other high scores in the shoot were Tripp, 91; Grube, 90; "Partington," 89; Griffith, 86, and Parry, 81.

The attendance of visiting shooters was large.
